EVACUATION PLANS & KIT Listen to battery-powered radio Follow instructions of local emergency officials Know how to evacuate your building Wear protective clothing and sturdy shoes Medications, list of allergies, extra eyeglasses Extra set of car keys, credit card, traveler's checks Make sure your kit/bag has your ID on it Whistle, to draw attention of emergency personnel Local maps, flares, trash bags, jumper cables Important family documents in waterproof container; some personal photos Implement your plan to take care of pets Lock your home when leaving
